It's GFWC RI's 63rd administration and I'm so proud to be part of this organization with 80,000 women strong. The General Federation of Women's Clubs is one of the oldest women's volunteer organizations in the USA – dating back to 1890.

My hope is that the GFWC RI state federation will continue to attract new members who will become leaders in this wonderful organization.

After spending a week in St. Louis at the GFWC Annual Convention with so many intelligent and creative GFWC ladies I was so impressed and humbled. There were women from our 50 states, along with a few members from some of the countries that have affiliate clubs: Aruba, Bahamas, Brazil, Canada, Cyprus, Ghana, Mexico, Curacao, Peru, Philippines, Taiwan, and Ukraine. As I rode the hotel elevators I made so many new friends. No matter where the clubwomen came from they all talked about familiar topics – projects and programs that included scholarships, literacy, fundraisers, social activities, veterans' affairs, conservation, leadership, arts, etc. Some of us told stories of how we joined this amazing organization.

The highlight of the Annual Convention was a service project that I took part in with over 400 other members. We put together 40,000 meals for international families and members collected \$18,000 toward those meals. The program was sponsored by the RISE Against Hunger Organization.



At the installation ceremony I was installed as GFWC RI's State President along with all the GFWC Presidents from the other states. Again, I was so in awe of what this organization does for us and for those in need.

I look forward to a productive administration, one that promotes many wonderful established programs and some new projects. Select one or two from the list below for your club to focus on this year.

- Join a committee, help fight homelessness, send personal care items to a shelter, visit a veteran or help send the Honor Flight to Washington DC on April 6, 2019.
- Donate to our international project, Operation Smile – GFWC RI will ask clubs to raise funds to fund an operation.
- Come to our state fundraiser on Oct 22 to support our Honor Flight for Veterans, give out scholarships, place books in locations all over the state including in the hands of shut-ins and people that sit in laundromats for hours.
- Invite a friend for Tea in Cranston, laugh with the Warwick ladies at their Comedy Show and/or sit by the Ocean in South County while listening to a woman author. Pack sandwiches with those Wampanoag ladies.

- Attend a Saturday Leadership Seminar.
- Help our International President, Mary Ellen Brock meet some of her initiatives for this administration:
 - Recycle some sneakers through the Nike "Reuse-a-Shoe" program
 - Plant a tree on Arbor Day
 - Donate a Dr. Seuss book to a local inner-city program or send to GFWC Headquarters to be distributed to inner city programs in Washington, DC



The primary responsibility of the Vice-President(s) is to act as Membership Chairman, and to encourage and assist existing clubs to maintain and extend their membership.

We need to go out, rebuild and strengthen our core group of members, remembering you cannot go out and recruit new players to a faltering team. Many clubs start up again in September - start the new club year off right by distributing member surveys - ask THEM what they liked/ disliked over the past year. Ask the club officers to give a list of their "Wells & Betters" (what they thought the club did well over the past year and what they thought the club could do better). When you are honest with yourselves on your weaknesses, you can focus on your strengths and come back with a renewed sense of purpose and focus.



Encourage all club members to subscribe to GFWC Clubwoman Magazine, which is mailed to subscribers four times per year; and GFWC News & Notes, a free, weekly electronic newsletter that offers tips and program ideas to enhance your club's community improvement

Grants

GFWC grants are available to clubs to assist with recruitment efforts. Funds are designated each GFWC fiscal year beginning July 1st and ending the following June 30th to help underwrite membership recruiting and rebuilding in your community. GFWC offers \$50 for club member recruitment programs. To apply for a club membership grant, please visit www.GFWC.org/Membership, email GFWC@GFWC.org, or contact 202-347-3168, to receive an application. You must return the application form to GFWC Headquarters at least 45 days prior to your event. While a GFWC club or district may submit grant applications. Any club having a Membership recruitment, please let Sandy know, and she will try to attend.

The time to recruit new members is September, October and November. Any club that recruits 3 new members will be recognized in Clubwoman magazine. You can find the form under "R" on the Resources page. Please submit a report even if your club only recruited one or two new members. Every Member Counts!

Arts Chairman Wanted

It is with a heavy heart that Carolyn Traxler, a member from the GFWC Women's Club of South County had to resign her board position as the Art's Chairman for GFWC RI. She has worked diligently for many years to promote the Arts and especially the GFWC RI Arts Scholarship program. She has worked in collaboration with the RI Art Teachers Association and Scholastic Inc. to present cash awards to high school students in both public and private schools throughout the state. RI has chosen to limit its



awards to those paintings which depict women in today's world.

This program will continue with the guidance of Diana Crane. She will continue to encourage young artists to continue to develop their talent. Diana is willing to work on this with someone who can take on the chairman position. The position also involves a chairman contacting the five clubs Art's chairman or president and pass on information that will be sent to her from GFWC headquarters in Washington DC. This is done by email. The Arts chairman will also share new ideas for art events, projects or theater happenings.

In January of each year, chairmen are responsible to email and encourage the clubs to submit reports on art projects or collaborations that can be reported on a designated form and sent to GFWC RI chairmen. Clubs will be acknowledged at the June 2019 Annual State Meeting. All GFWC RI chairman are asked to attend four meetings a year as a board member and report any events, projects, fundraisers for the Arts. The following are the meetings: Aug 8, 2018, Sept 17, 2018, January 19, 2019, April 17, 2019 All meetings are at 6:00 pm at EBC Center 821 West Shore Rd. Warwick. The Art's Chairman is a member of the GFWC Board of Directors. The chairman also attends the June 9 state meeting to give out club awards. If you are unable to attend a meeting, arrangements can be made for someone to read the report. I would encourage clubs to support anyone who is motivated to accept this position and join her committee to help.

surfaces. Collect from friends and family and drop them at a Nike store. The nearest is at the Wrentham Mall.


A second initiative involves planting a tree on Arbor Day.

GFWC initiative--VIAL OF LIFE

The first thing first responders want to know is your list of medications. The difference between life and death when you've had a heart attack could be a copy of your previous EKG. When you can't speak for yourself, when you are confused, in pain or scared, the Vial of Life can speak for you.

In an emergency the Vial of Life will speak for you when you can't!

Even during normal doctor visits, the Vial of Life will help you tell the doctors and nurses what medications you are taking, and the ailments that you have.

What goes in the plastic bag on the front of your refrigerator door.

- A completed Vial of Life form. (Answer the questions you want; don't answer questions you don't want)

- Providing a picture of yourself would be helpful.
- A photocopy of your last EKG will greatly assist the emergency personnel. (Your doctor will be able to provide you with a copy)
- Place your Living Will or equivalent in your baggie, if you have one.
- Place any Do Not Resuscitate (DNR) documentation in the baggie, if you so choose
- Place any other documentation you feel important in the baggie.

Tape the baggie on your refrigerator.

Place a decal (free download or order on line) on your front door.



Legislative Action Terry Schimmel, Chairman

Four members of the GFWC RI Legislative Action Committee, Terry Schimmel, Mary Grace Varnum, Deb Zepp, and Angela Libman, met with Senator Jack Reed on July 27th to share with him the mission of our organization. They provided an overview of GFWC from a National & State level. They shared the GFWC legislative action that has been taken for three primary issues: Gun Control, ERA and Immigration. Senator Reed gave us some of his insights and actions that we need to continue to support. He did say that with many of these issues will be addressed by the court system. Senator Reed and all of us briefly discussed the current possibility of instructions available on the internet to make guns on 3D printers. Senator Reed spoke that many of "cyber" situations can't rely on some of the more typical approaches to address these problems.

He invited us back and said that he is positive about the type of exchanges we had today. In our opinion, Senator Reed was highly engaged during our dialogue and seemed genuinely interested in talking to us.

GFWC RI President's Special Project RI Fire Chiefs Honor Flight

The Rhode Island Fire Chiefs Honor Flight Hub is a 501(c) (3) tax exempt organization whose mission is to bring America's Veterans to Washington, DC to visit and reflect on those memorials built to honor their service and sacrifice. RI has taken 18 flights to DC. Veterans have been from World War I, World War II and the Korean War. There will be two more flights coming up one in Sept, another in October.



I am pleased to announce that on Saturday, April 6, 2019 GFWC RI will sponsor an Honor Flight to Washington DC. The goal is to send 25-woman veterans on an Honor flight. This will be the first time an all-women's flight will leave Rhode Island. Chief George Farrell is the Chairman of the Honor Flight. He is working closely with GFWC RI to make this a wonderful day for some special woman veterans in RI really happen. This is not an easy project to implement. George will do all the technical work. He has already got permission and ordered a large wreath for the tomb of the unknown soldier. Women veterans from RI will place this wreath on April 6, 2019.

What can your club do to make this happen? First know that this is a Public Issues/ Affairs project that you can report on. It has three phases: planning, fundraising, the actual flight. As a clubwoman in RI you can get involved in many ways: recruit a woman veteran from one of the above wars, make snail mail packages at the state meeting in January, donate, be at the airport either at 5 am or 10 pm with signs or flowers to cheer the veterans on April 6, 2019.

You may also be a Guardian. A Guardian stays with a veteran all day and enjoys DC. Guardians pay \$500 to go which includes flight and meals. Guardians have a training. Guardians attend a Meet and Greet prior to flight. GFWC RI will be having a fundraiser Oct 22 to help with some of this. We are recruiting two clubwomen from each club to be on my special Honor Flight Committee. Contact Karen Leach for more details either at my email or 401-749-2894

Next it was off to Roger William Park to place boots and flags in honor of more than 7,000 veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan.

Up-coming projects include getting involved with Raising Readers in Rhode Island; a program working to create access to book ownership among K-3 to low-income students to improve reading rates. We will be working with Kate Lentz of Rhode Island Center for the Book with an expectation of delivering books to schools in Central Falls, Pawtucket, Providence and Woonsocket.



At our August and September meetings we will be collecting new socks and underwear to donate to clients of TAP-IN (Touch-A-Person-in-Need). Some 200 low-income students will be receiving book bags with supplies, why not new socks and underwear to start the year of right? Located in Barrington, (Sandy is a volunteer), TAP-IN serves the East Bay Area. Being planned for October is Sip and Shop. Stay tuned for details.

Eulogy given July 28, 2018

Good Afternoon friends and family of Judy. My name is Karen Leach; I am President of the General Federation of Women's Clubs of Rhode Island.



Today I represent all the clubwomen in RI past and present in expressing our sincere condolences to Judy's family along with those clubwomen who couldn't be here for this celebration of her life. Judy was a dedicated member of GFWC as we call it. A volunteer organization dedicated to community service.

She was first introduced to the organization many years ago when she lived in Cape Cod and joined the Falmouth Women's Club. She has been in GFWC since 1975. During her time in Falmouth she became very friendly with Ann Holland who ended up being the International President of GFWC. Ann and she remained friends and their paths would cross in many ways.

When Judy moved to Kingston she joined the Women's Club of South County. I am sure Judy was a little inspired by Ann Holland from Falmouth when Judy was nominated the Club President of the Women's Club of South County from 1987 to 1990. Judy was instrumental in starting the Exeter, R.I. Library. (A representative from the Library accepted donations for the Library)

The Women's Club of SC which was organized in 1962 and during Judy's administration there were 95 members. Much like today it was an active force in the South County Community. Judy was encouraged by her friends to be RI's state President, she felt nervous to do such. I think her friends were pretty convincing, so she became GFWC Rhode Island's President 2008 - 2010. She was on the by-laws committee for many years and helped write the rules we still use today; her last position was a trustee for the GFWC RI endowment.

My own memory of her is all about dedication. It was a cold winter day in 2009 and a Winter state meeting in Narragansett was planned at the hotel overlooking the beach, my friend Ethel then the President of the Cranston Women's Club was also a good friend of Judy's and convinced me to take the ride to Narragansett from Cranston. I was in the Cranston Club and that seemed like quite a journey in January. There were very few members that came that day about 12. Judy was very joyful, saying this will be easy, we can relax and enjoy a beautiful day at the beach. She went through all her agenda diligently and then we socialized. I remember her welcoming me and Ethel and appreciated that we had come so far.

After getting to know Judy I realized she was probably relieved there wasn't a big crowd that day because she was basically shy. This was my first pleasant and memorable meeting with Judy. Her friend, Mary Irons, wanted me to tell you what a dedicated and lovely woman she was. A good friend to Mary. They would go to convention and conferences together and sit with their friend Alice Donahue from Barrington who also had become an International President. I am sure they enjoyed themselves and maybe had a drink or two while critiquing the meetings.

So today we share our family and friends' story about Judy and I think of her as an example for myself as I embark on my new position as President. She was dedicated, charitable, conscientious and a good friend. May she rest in peace.
